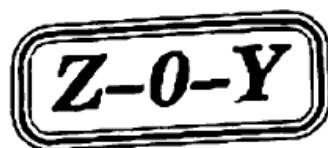

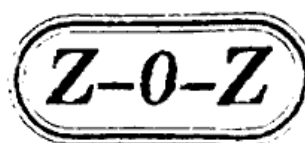

Hornbills are omnivorous, meaning they eat both plants and animals. Their diet mainly consists of fruits, insects, small mammals, reptiles and birds. They have a unique feeding habit where they catch their prey with their bill and then toss it up in the air before swallowing it whole. This behaviour helps them to ensure that the prey is properly positioned before swallowing.

These birds are also known for their nesting habits. Hornbills are cavity nesters, meaning they build their nests inside tree cavities. The female hornbill seals herself inside the nest cavity using a mixture of mud, droppings and food remains. She leaves only a small slit through which the male can pass food to her and the chicks. This behaviour is believed to protect the female and her offspring from predators.

Hornbills are highly territorial birds and defend their nesting sites vigorously. The male hornbill will often engage in arial displays to

establish his territory and attract a mate. These displays involve flying in large circles, calling loudly and clashing their bills together. The male will also bring food to the female as part of the courtship ritual. Once the female lays her eggs, she incubates them for about 25 to 40 days. During this time, the male continues to bring food to the female and the chicks. After hatching, the chicks remain in the nest for several weeks until they are ready to fledge. Once they leave the nest, the parents continue to care for them and teach them how to find food and defend themselves. Hornbills play an important role in their ecosystems as seed dispersers. They consume fruits and then disperse the seeds through their droppings, helping to regenerate forests. Some species of hornbills are also considered indicators of forest health, as they rely on large undisturbed areas of forest for their survival.

Unfortunately, hornbills face numerous threats in the wild. Habitat loss due to deforestation and illegal hunting are the primary factors contributing to their decline. Conservation efforts are underway to

protect these magnificent birds and their habitats, but more needs to be done to ensure their long-term survival.
